

Scripture

¹So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: ² shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; ³ not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. ⁴ And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. ⁵ Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

⁶ Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, ⁷ casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. ⁸ Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. ⁹ Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. ¹⁰ And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you. ¹¹ To him be the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

¹² By Silvanus, a faithful brother as I regard him, I have written briefly to you, exhorting and declaring that this is the true grace of God. Stand firm in it. ¹³ She who is at Babylon, who is likewise chosen, sends you greetings, and so does Mark, my son. ¹⁴ Greet one another with the kiss of love.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: How and who did you pray for, seeking the peace of God in the church family this past week?

Point 1: Leaders are to lead by example

- How does the metaphor of "shepherds" describe the role of church leaders? What qualities should shepherds possess?
- Verse 3 warns against "lording over" the flock. What does this mean, and how can leaders avoid this temptation?

Point 2: Submitting to leaders is an act of faith that grows you

- Why is submitting to church leaders important for the health of the church?
- What does it mean to "submit yourselves to one another" in the context of the church? How can we demonstrate humility and respect for one another?
- How can we balance our desire for autonomy with the need for submission within the church?

Point 3: Being humble will confirm and establish you in Christ

- What does it mean to "humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God"? How does humility lead to spiritual growth and maturity?
- Verse 7 says, "Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you." How can humility help us to trust in God's providence and find peace in our lives?
- How can we resolve conflicts and disagreements within the church in a way that promotes unity and peace?

Application Questions:

- How can we foster a culture of respect and mutual support within our church community?
- How can we cultivate humility in our daily lives? What practices or disciplines can help us to develop a humble spirit?
